HOUSE HANSARD (DEBATES)



DEFINITION

- "The Hansard transcript is the official record of House debates. A typical Hansard issue includes a table of contents, a transcript of what is said, divisions (votes), and a list of members and their ridings." ([The Assembly website](#))
- A historically significant role in informing the public the daily proceedings of the Legislative Assembly.
- House Hansard transcripts are digitally available from the 29th parliament, 4th session to present on the Assembly website in PDF and/or html formats.

THE CURRENT SEARCH

- Available through the Assembly website (<http://hansardindex.ontla.on.ca/>)
- Full text search database on Ontario House Hansard from March 11, 1975, to present.
- Released in 1999.

ADVANCED HANSARD SEARCH MODERNIZATION PROJECT

WHY? BECAUSE... IT'S TIME FOR MODERNIZE!

- Identified that some functions did not work (e.g. NEAR) and there were errors and missing data (e.g. no proper heading).
- The current search is more than 20 years old:
 - Old technology
 - Old-fashioned design
 - Lack of accessibility
- Well-used search tool (over 242,000 searches, approx. 5,800 users from January 1 to December 4, 2023).
- Valuable for MPPs, internal staff and the public.



ADVANCED HANSARD SEARCH MODERNIZATION PROJECT

OVERVIEW

- A "lift and drop" project to replace the current search tool
- Started in summer 2023 by the Information Services Branch
- Consulted with the Legislative Library



ADVANCED HANSARD SEARCH MODERNIZATION PROJECT


GOALS

- New advanced search tool for this unique data built on current, stable technology.
- A secure infrastructure that adheres to our design and accessibility goals.
- Improves search capability, created clean machine-readable datasets with proper heading.

HIGHLIGHTS

- 
- New search tool built using Drupal and Solr used for the Assembly website.
 - ✓ Modern design
 - ✓ Bilingual interface
 - ✓ AODA compliant
 - Uses React, the framework the websites like Facebook, Instagram, and Uber are built with.
 - Staff have corrected and structured Hansard transcripts to make machine-readable House Hansard data.
 - Scraped and structured the content using tools such as ParseHub, Excel and OpenRefine.

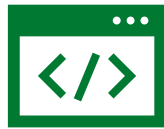
