

# 1. Program History

- Web Archiving had been conducted experimentally within the National Library of Canada since 2002.
- International Internet Preservation Consortium (IIPC) was chartered in 2003 with LAC as a founding member (Chair in 2008 and again in 2015)
- LAC's Web Archiving Program launched in December 2005.
- From, activities concentrated on capturing:
  - The GC domain (2005, 2006, 2007)
  - Provincial and Federal Elections
  - Summer and Winter Olympics
  - Commemoration (State funerals; Calgary Stampede, the War of 1812)







# 1. What is Web Archiving Anyway?

- Is an internationally-practiced, digital preservation and curationbased discipline that guarantees future access to unique resources from the Web
  - LAC Web Unit situated in the digital preservation area and is responsible for the program from end to end (acquisition to access)
  - Team consists of digital librarians and digital archivists that bring their perspectives to bear on the web archival curation
  - Specialized Web Unit created in April 2022, previously part of a larger portfolio (web archives and digital private and government archival records)
  - Digital Librarians and Digital Archivists on the curation team

# 2. Canadian Legislative Context: LAC Act section 8 (2)

### Powers of Librarian and Archivist

• 8 (1) The Librarian and Archivist may do anything that is conducive to the attainment of the objects of the Library and Archives of Canada, including

• (2) In exercising the powers referred to in paragraph (1)(a) and for the purpose of preservation, the Librarian and Archivist may take, at the times and in the manner that he or she considers appropriate, a representative sample of the documentary material of interest to Canada that is accessible to the public without restriction through the Internet or any similar medium.

# Quick Word on Web Curation Methodology

- When thematic web archival collections are begun, a collection development policy is defined
- The CD policy defines the scope in/out and what we are trying to document (in what priority, degree of comprehension, quality level)
- E.g., COVID-19: Impact on Business and Economy; Families and Education; Law, Arts and Culture, News Media, Fed/Prov Govts...
- These seed groups or collection sub-themes get assigned for curation to staff members, and are tracked in metadata for project status
- These subthemes then appear in GCWA as resource discovery facets...







# Commissions Collection in GCWA

- LAC's previous Index to Federal Royal Commissions was decommissioned in the switch to OCLC (and not replaced)
- A new curation tool enables the presentation of new collections
- Commissions exist in digitized historical copies, born digital, and websites; websites began in 2001 (Romanow/O'Connor) but these were previously in an isolated dataset
- For the first time, a comprehensive collection is now available in one place, with all the GCWA's discovery/access/search tools applied
- MMIWG, POEC, MCC will be available (FIC / FIFEPDI site launched [foreigninterferencecommission.ca] and collection has begun...)

# Foreign Interference Commission

On September 7, 2023 the Government of Canada established the Public Inquiry into Foreign Interference in Federal Electoral Processes and Democratic Institutions. Justice Marie-Josée Hogue, a judge of the Quebec Court of Appeal, was appointed Commissioner.

The Commission will undertake its work in two phases. The first phase will focus on the interference that China, Russia and other foreign actors may have engaged in, and any impact it may have had on the 2019 and 2021 federal elections. The Commission will also examine and assess the flow of information within the federal government in relation to these issues, and evaluate the actions taken in response.

In the second phase, the Commission will examine the capacity of federal departments, agencies, institutional structures, and governance processes to permit the Government of Canada to detect, deter and counter such interference.

The Commission will hold public hearings in early 2024 and in the fall of 2024.

The Order in Council 2023-0882 requires that the Commission submit an Interim Report by February 29, 2024, and a Final Report by December 31, 2024.
