

- Hold government to account

Representation

- Represent the interest of their constituents
- Consult on legislation and issues of national importance
- Make recommendations to government through reports



- Vision: To be Parliament's preferred and trusted source of information and knowledge
- Mission: The Library of Parliament contributes to Canadian parliamentary democracy by creating, managing and delivering authoritative, reliable and relevant information and knowledge for and about Parliament
- Guiding Principles: Agility, Collaboration, Excellence, Impartiality and Inclusion
- Enabling Legislation: The Parliament of Canada Act
- Established: 1841 (with the amalgamation of the Upper and Lower Canada Legislative Libraries)





Library of Parliament Governance Structure


- Speakers of the Senate and House of Commons
 Responsible for the direction and control of the Library of Parliament in accordance with the Parliament of Canada Act.
- Standing Joint Committee on the Library of Parliament
 Composed of senators and of members of Parliament, this
 committee assists the Speakers in reviewing the
 effectiveness, management and operation of the Library.
- Parliamentary Librarian
 Responsible for overseeing the management of the Library, and has the status of a deputy head, reporting to the two Speakers.





Collection Spotlight highlights the Library of Parliament's collection of rare books, art, artefacts and more. New Collection Spotlights are added regularly.


