EXPLANATORY NOTE.

This bill is in aid of the public's right to know in what manner a government is administering the public duties entrusted and delegated to it by the people: save for exceptions that are in the public interest, the bill enacts Bentham's basic parliamentary Rule that public affairs must be conducted publicly.






The principle of this Bill is: that the citizen's right to know the public business is fundamental to a participatory democracy. The purpose of the Bill is to establish that right as a fundamental freedom under the protection of the courts.

ACCESS TO INFORMATION IG A BASIC HUMAN RIGHT


















Next steps
